"I love her, but I cannot get her to stop talking most of the time!" Laiza, Ropafadzo's mother, said with a laugh in her voice.

Ropafadzo has a big personality packaged in a small body. Her contagious smile stretches from ear to ear and will win your heart over in a second!

Although Ropafadzo is only four years old, she has already had more doctor's visits than any child her age ever should. She was originally admitted into a local hospital for a fever. Staff there noticed her clubfoot condition and, once well enough, she was referred to the CURE Children's Hospital of Zimbabwe for treatment of her clubfoot.

This condition has restricted her ability to stand, walk, and move around freely. But it doesn't hold her back from lighting up every room she is in with her witty comments!

"Mama, why are you sitting in my chair?" she asks her mother, who responds with a laugh. "I'm not joking mum, that's my chair!"

The procedure loosened the tendons in Ropafadzo's left leg, releasing her foot, allowing it to sit straight. During her recovery she was comfortable in the ward, not experiencing much post-op discomfort and bringing a joyful presence to everyone at the CURE Children's Hospital!
